Report of the Police Chief

The most important event that took place in the Department was the Retirement of Chief Andrew O'Malley. The Chief retired after 32 years of distinguished service to the Town of Belmont. He retired on April 30th. He was replaced temporarily by Assistant Chief Richard Lane until a new permanent Chief could be found.

The year 2006 has been another challenging year for the men and women of Belmont Police Department. In January the Department welcomed one new officer that had just graduated from the Lowell Police Academy. This brought our total number of Officers up to 41. We also hired six other officers that graduated in September and were on the street fully trained on November 5, 2006. We ended the year with 45 sworn officers, one person in the police academy and a new chief arriving.

Keeping the Department fully staffed during a majority of the year was difficult. Not only was the Department down 7 officers due to retirement, and resignations but we also had several officers injured on duty and out sick with injuries. This caused severe strain on the officers that were here to work many long days to fill all the needs of the Town.

During the year many technical changes took place that the general public might not notice but have helped us become more efficient. We installed a new phone system that will make it a lot easer to communicate not only with the public but also other town departments. We worked with Motorola to install a new radio console and also worked with Verizon to update the 9-1-1 system. All of these changes make Belmont a safer place to live.

The members of the Belmont Police Department will continue in our efforts to be responsive to the needs of the public and to continue with our collaboration with town officials and community members in order to effectively address these needs.
