**Report of the Police Chief**

The Belmont Police Department continued the re-organization plan started in 2003. The Belmont Police Department has its' first Assistant Chief. Lt. Richard Lane was selected for this position and promoted by former Town Administrator Mel Kleckner in August of 2004.

We have again been reduced in numbers. Last year we were reduced from fifty officers to forty-eight and this year we have been budgeted for forty-seven officers. We continue to provide the best services possible to the public at large and the citizens of Belmont in particular. Our resources have been diminished but the dedicated men and women of the Belmont Police Department continue to excel in their jobs serving the people Belmont.

In 2004, we had our first Belmont Police Department "Awards Presentation". Among the recipients were Officer Robert Sacca, Officer Michael McHugh, Officer William Monahan Jr. and Sergeant Gerard Greeley,

In further attempts to find cost savings, the police department has absorbed the Joint Public Safety Communication Department. The JPSC is managed by Operations Manager Dan MacAuley and comes under the direction of the Chief of Police.

In calendar year 2004, Officer Joseph Cullen retired with thirty-one years of service, Officer Michael Logan transferred to the Newton Police Department and Officer Richard McCarron resigned to take a position with the Massachusetts State Police.

We welcomed Belmont resident, Officer Todd Benedetti, who was employed in August of 2004.
